INTRODUCTION

We will start the quarter with two new exhibitions which we will launch on April 15: Anarchivo SIDA and The Day After, by Maryam Jafri. The first is the result of research by Equipo re about cultural production and AIDS policies and will be accompanied by a special education programme to delve into the subject. The second revolves around the concept of archive from Jafri's Independence Day, a collection of photographs from the days of independence of African and Asian colonies, which will give us the opportunity to reflect on archive issues and our colonial past, a reflection that will also extend to seminars on Stimulants, colonialism and the crossroads of routes between *Equatorial Guinea and the Basque* Country, as part of the Stimulants: Traffic and Euphoria project. We will also delve into the project through other meetings, such as Café Complot and Smoke Policies.

The cinema focus will be on Charles Burnett, Teresa Villaverde and Martin Rejtman, with the presence of all of them at some point. We will continue with our laboratories, this time with the ONLSD collective, who were awarded at Clermont Ferrand, the Crater-Lab collective and Rejtman himself.

At Hirikilabs, we will pay special attention to sound and its relationship with electronics, access to information and data neutrality and the fifth call for open source projects will be launched.

In terms of things that can be enjoyed as a family, we will continue with *JoLabs* and the *Kamaleoiak gara!* series, with special guests like Maria Jerez. In April, we will première Kamaleoiak gara! in the morning cinema slot.

With the opening of Ubik, we can also offer a continuous service to make cultural content of the project accessible and the possibility of trying different creation tools, as well as programmes where we delve deep into the content.

There is much to do and enjoy. And we did not have enough time to tell you about everything.

The exhibition Anarchivo sida is the result of a process of research and production by the collective Equipo re. It takes cultural production about the AIDS crisis in southern Europe and Latin America as its starting point. The exhibition will address the classic nature / culture articulation through three issues: the historical trend of dividing humans from animals: the cultural dimension of death: and health. understood as the convention by which some bodies are considered normal and others sick. Overall, the exhibition will feature content from the mid-eighties to the present with materials that have never been assembled together.

Anarchivo sida is a research and production project led by Equipo re, which is presented in an exhibition format and programme of activities, co-produced by DSS2016EU and Tabakalera.

"*Eden's Edge* is a film portrait in three parts about Hollywood's probably most prominent landscape icon from the viewpoint of people living there. Initially marked by exceptional directorial sobriety, we see bird eye views of minimalistic scenes, meticulously arranged in gray desert sands, usually furnished with very few props. Within this context, barely insect size inhabitants move about hermits. mavericks and freaks in the best sense of the word. They all have retreated to the desert, to reinvent their lives on the margins of an increasingly unbearable society. JUNE FOCUS: MARTÍN REJTMAN

" My job is to look, listen and, based on this, write or film. I work a lot with observation, with things that happen to me, that people tell me or that I see. I process everything in a strange way and it becomes a story or a script. And before I start writing or decide what I'm going to shoot, I study the area." Martín Rejtman.

Argentine writer, screenwriter and film director (Buenos Aires, 1961), Rejtman is one of those directors of whom one can be a big fan. We are: of his films and his characters, of his rare comedies, of how he films Buenos Aires, of how his characters walk, dance, listen to music and run, of his portraits, of his "special" rhythm (neither very fast or very slow), of the titles of his works, of his way of combining writing, cinema and style, of the everyday life and smallest details of his plots, of how they grow after his films, and, in short, of his way of understanding and creating cinema and literature. This is the Rejtman territory: a retrospective to his work, a workshop on cinema and writing and a carte blanche.

FOCUS: CHARLES BURNETT In collaboration with the Play-Doc

CINEMA

International Documentary Festival.

"I think a strong case can be made that Charles Burnett is the most gifted and important black film maker this country has ever had. But there's a fair chance that you've never have heard of him...." Jonathan Rosenbaum, American film critic.

Watts was, and still is, one of these tough neighbourhoods in Los Angeles where gangs and ethnic minority communities live in a delicate balance with the police. Burnett (Vicksburg, Mississippi, 1944) came to Watts in 1947, so all of his memories of childhood and youth are linked to the neighbourhood, which would later become material for his films. It was at the University of California, in the cinema and ethno-communications department, that Burnett began to give form to his imagination and where, together with other film makers, he created the L.A. Rebellion, a creative, political space to give a voice to the most disadvantaged communities. Burnett is considered a neo-realist director: in his films he portrays a direct, raw reality, but without ever neglecting lyricism, aesthetics and a humanist quest. Using his method of "approaching reality and showing what it hides", Burnett was always a political director and, in this review of his filmography, we will learn about his thinking and his most emblematic works.

The focus on his films and visit of the film maker will be completed

with the joint publication (together with the Play-Doc International Documentary Festival) and presentation of the first world monograph dedicated to the African American author: *Charles Burnett, full* of anger but without hate.







The relationship between curator and artist is full of nuances and meanings. 
Fran Meana, artist.

The history of the Laboratory of Forms. The project aims to recover and revive the legacy of Isaac Díaz Pardo's Laboratory of Forms, taking the book "Discusión sobre la organización de las Industrias Manufactureras" (Discussion on the organisation of manufacturing industries) as a starting point. Published in 1960 by Díaz Pardo, the book analyses the social and political dimension of his artistic output and explores the connections between art and work.

Harvey Martínez, artist.

The project *La ciudad dispersa* (City sprawl) is part of El milagro (The miracle), a multidisciplinary project where, in this case, the first job is to research and document the footprint of *Developmentalism* in San Sebastian, undertake a publication/ test and, at the same time, a group of sculptures / installation referring to the developmentalist footprint in Gipuzkoa.
